





Comal County — on the Interstate 35 corridor between Austin and San Antonio — ranked as the nation's second-fastest-growing county among those with a population equal to or greater than 20,000. Kaufman County, a D-FW suburban county, ranked third on the list. West Texas made a return to the top 10 list than as to rapid growth in Midland County, which helped it rank sixth. Hood County, also in the D-FW area, came in ninth.
